




AFC ELITE YOUTH SCHEME

Our aims are to:

- Raise standards;
- Support, evaluate and recognise player development programmes in AFC Member Associations; and
- Provide guidelines for the identification, protection and education of young, talented players.

PLAYER SAFEGUARDING

It is fundamental that each player development programme (club or national) has a player safeguarding policy which is fully implemented. Every young player has the right to live free of violence, exploitation and abuse.

AFC'S GUIDING PRINCIPLE

DEFINITIONS

In these Regulations, capitalised terms shall have the following meanings, unless the context specifically indicates otherwise:

| Academy | A centre for the development of talented youth players, established by the relevant government, a Member Association or professional club. |
|-----------------------|--|
| AFC | Asian Football Confederation. |
| AFC Committee | Any Committee of the AFC as constituted in accordance with the AFC Statutes. |
| AFC Youth Panel | The panel of specialists in the field of elite youth football development, appointed in accordance with these Regulations. |
| Endorsement | The AFC's recognition of a Member Association's work in youth development. |
| Force Majeure | Any event affecting the performance or any provision of these Regulations arising from or attributable to acts, events, omissions or accidents which are beyond the reasonable control of a party. This shall include without limitation abnormally inclement weather, flood, lightning, storm, fire, explosion, earthquake, structural damage, epidemic, pandemic or other natural disaster, failure or shortage of power supplies, war, terrorist action, military operations, riot, crowd disorder, strike, lock-outs or other industrial action, or civil commotion. |
| Key Criteria | The criteria set by the AFC for each performance category of the Scheme as described in Part C and E of Annex 1. |
| Member Association | A football association which is a member of the AFC pursuant to the AFC Statutes. |

| Youth Programme | A Member Association's player development programme which includes activities in addition to international youth competition matches. |

For the purposes of these Regulations, and provided the context so permits:

- (a) the singular shall include the plural and vice-versa;
- (b) the masculine gender shall include the feminine and vice-versa;
- (c) references to natural persons shall include any legal person or corporation;
- (d) references to the AFC shall include its successors and permitted assigns, and the AFC Committees: and
- (e) all defined terms, unless otherwise stated herein shall bear the same meaning as ascribed in the AFC Statutes, unless the context indicates otherwise.



THE CONCEPT

An integral part of the AFC's Vision and Mission is to improve playing standards and increase the possibility of success at the top level. The development of aspiring young talents is at the core of these objectives, and the AFC recognises and supports the Member Associations in their efforts to further develop their elite youth programme, including the grading of academies in line with the criteria set by the AFC.

Together, the AFC and the Member Associations will set the benchmark for elite player development in training centres and support the clubs and their academies in nurturing the next generation of toplevel professional players.

A number of factors influence the standard of football in a country e.g. coaching levels, competition structures, grassroots football, talent identification and elite player development. The Scheme targets the latter and is used to support and endorse the talent development work of each Member Association, including its Academies.

SCOPE AND PHILOSOPHY

The AFC defines elite youth football as football played by a select group of talented young boys and girls, either at national team level or in a professional club environment.

The scope of the Scheme will be limited to the work of the Member Associations and to the Academies attached to top division clubs or otherwise classified as national training centres. The evaluation of these Academies will be graded according to the following three categories:



For the AFC, youth development is a core responsibility and the following principles are considered fundamental:

- 1. The welfare of youth players is a priority.
- 2. Education, on and off the pitch, takes precedence over short-term results. Tomorrow is more important than today.
- 3. Good coaching is indispensable.
- **4.** The development of each youth player's personality, good habits, emotional stability, commitment, physical attributes, technical ability and game appreciation are all important.
- 5. Mutual respect between players, staff and parents/guardians is a must.



Why is the Scheme important?

- 1. The Scheme helps to improve the game of football in Asia by stimulating a greater interest in structured, high-quality elite player development programmes at national team and club level.
- 2. The AFC supports its Member Associations with their programmes, including the establishment and or development of their youth Academies.
- 3. The Scheme aims to produce Asia's next generation of star players and provide basic guidelines for their education.
- 4. A key objective of the Scheme is to help Member Associations and their clubs conform to the club licensing requirements.
- 5. The vital role of each Member Association, including its Academies, as a link between grassroots football and the professional game is highlighted.
- 6. Establishing Academies helps to develop professional players who have a relationship/identify with their Member Associations and their training clubs.
- 7. Talent identification and recruitment policies are addressed and elaborated.
- 8. The requirement to employ appropriately-educated youth coaches, at national and club level, has a significant impact on player development.
- 9. Benchmarks are set, comparisons are made and healthy competition between Member Associations will follow. The same applies to club Academies.
- 10. Promoting elite youth football in Asia through national programmes and specialised training centres will have a long-term impact on raising playing standards.

AFC ELITE YOUTH SCHEME REGULATIONS (2024 EDITION)

Article 1: INTRODUCTION

- **1.1.** These Regulations govern the implementation and operation of the Scheme.
- **1.2.** These Regulations, *inter alia*:
 - 1.2.1. define the rights and duties of the Member Associations and the AFC in relation to the Scheme:
 - 1.2.2. set the Key Criteria at three (3) levels for Member Association and Academy recognitions as described in 1B of Annex 1 and 2B of Annex 2, respectively; and
 - 1.2.3. set out the evaluation process in 3C of Annex 3.
- 1.3. Any rights and proprietary interests associated with the Scheme that are not granted by these Regulations and/or specific agreements to any Member Association or third-party shall vest in the AFC.
- **1.4.** Any reference to the AFC Statutes and to the AFC and FIFA Regulations is made to the edition valid at the time of application.

Article 2: RIGHTS OF THE AFC

- **2.1.** The AFC is the governing body of the Scheme and has the following rights and powers, without limitation:
 - 2.1.1. to monitor the implementation of the Scheme;
 - 2.1.2. to appoint specific member(s) of the AFC Youth Panel to assess, guide and review a Member Association's work in elite youth development, including the grading of Academies, in accordance with the Key Criteria;
 - 2.1.3. to confirm or amend a Scheme Member's Endorsement status or the grading of a specific Academy; and
 - 2.1.4. to make any decision deemed necessary to achieve the aims set out in the Scheme and take any measure deemed appropriate in the event of a breach of these Regulations by a Member Association or one of its affiliated clubs.

Article 3: DUTIES OF THE AFC

- **3.1.** The AFC has the following duties:
 - to organise regular events for Member Associations' youth leaders which are relevant to the development of the Scheme;

- **3.1.2.** to make decisions regarding the assessment of a Member Association, including its national centre(s) and to validate its club Academy recommendations;
- **3.1.3.** to collaborate closely with each Scheme Member on the application, implementation and maintenance of the Scheme;
- **3.1.4.** to communicate regularly with each Scheme Member about elite youth development; and
- **3.1.5.** to respect its own duties and the rights of each Scheme Member.

Article 4: RIGHTS OF THE SCHEME MEMBERS

- **4.1.** Each Scheme Member has the following rights:
 - **4.1.1.** to implement its own elite youth programme, including club Academy grading;
 - **4.1.2.** to request the AFC, at any time (but at least six [6] months after the previous Endorsement), to upgrade the category of evaluation;
 - **4.1.3.** to inform and liaise with the AFC, at any time, to assess/validate any of its Academies;
 - **4.1.4.** to submit a re-evaluation request to the AFC within three (3) months of a downgrading (i.e. a non-fulfilment of any Key Criteria) to regain its previous Scheme Member status or the category of evaluation of an Academy; and
 - **4.1.5.** to cancel their Scheme Membership at any time by notifying the AFC of the reasons in writing.

Article 5: DUTIES OF THE SCHEME MEMBERS

- **5.1.** Each Scheme Member has the following duties:
 - **5.1.1.** to promote and develop its elite youth programme, in collaboration with its affiliated clubs/national centres and youth Academies;
 - **5.1.2.** to protect youth players in their programmes and/or at their affiliated clubs (including the mandatory child protection policy) and to respect all participants in their elite youth activities;
 - **5.1.3.** to maintain and monitor its elite youth programme at the level approved by the AFC, and where possible, to improve and develop this programme;
 - **5.1.4.** to regularly provide the AFC with information about its elite youth activities;
 - **5.1.5.** to establish and maintain a database/registration system providing elite youth player data, in a format acceptable to the AFC;
 - **5.1.6.** to use the AFC intellectual property solely in connection with the Scheme subject always in compliance with the instructions issued by the AFC and only with the express written approval of the AFC;
 - **5.1.7.** to contribute to the achievement of the aims of the Scheme; and



5.1.8. to respect its own duties and the AFC's rights as defined in these Regulations, as well as any decision made by the AFC.

Article 6: RENEWAL

6.1. In order to ensure the maintenance of a continuous standard of quality, each Scheme Member will be subject to re-evaluation after three (3) years from its last Endorsement.

Article 7: AFC YOUTH PANEL

- 7.1. The AFC Technical Committee has the responsibility for monitoring and handling all matters relating to the Scheme.
- 7.2. The AFC Technical Committee may delegate the responsibility for the implementation, assessment and decision-making on Member Association(s) evaluations under these Regulations (including decisions regarding Member Association(s) applications to join the Scheme in accordance with the procedure in Part E of Annex 1 of these Regulations) to the AFC Youth Panel, subject to the approval of the AFC Executive Committee.
- 7.3. All decisions of the AFC Youth Panel will be promptly communicated to the AFC Technical Committee. The AFC Technical Committee will thereafter promptly communicate such decisions to the AFC Executive Committee.
- 7.4. The AFC General Secretariat shall provide administrative and secretarial support to the AFC Technical Committee and/or the AFC Youth Panel (as appropriate) in connection with the implementation and operation of the Scheme.
- 7.5. The AFC Technical Committee may delegate the responsibility for selecting and appointing members of the AFC Youth Panel to the AFC General Secretariat.

Article 8: REQUIREMENTS

- 8.1. Both the AFC and the Scheme Member shall identify the key person(s) responsible in their own respective organisation for managing the implementation of the Scheme. Any change of personnel must be communicated to the other party without delay.
- 8.2. Both the AFC and the Scheme Member have a general duty to inform the other party of any elite youth-related developments or changes.
- 8.3. All eleven (11) Member Association criteria must be fulfilled at each level (Three-Star, Two-Star, One-Star) in order for the AFC Endorsement to be granted.

Article 9: DISPUTES

- **9.1.** These Regulations are subject to the laws of Malaysia.
- 9.2. The Scheme Members agree that any dispute arising from or related to the Regulations which cannot be settled amicably shall be resolved in accordance with the relevant provisions of the AFC Statutes.
- 9.3. Disputes involving domestic club Academies programmes should be resolved by the respective Scheme Member.

Article 10: LANGUAGES

- **10.1.** These Regulations are written in English but can be translated into other languages with the approval of the AFC.
- 10.2. In case of any differences in interpretation, the English version shall prevail.

Article 11: TAXES, DUTIES, FEES, EXPENSES

- **11.1.** Member Associations are responsible for the payment of all taxes, duties, and other charges payable in relation to the implementation of the Scheme in their respective territories.
- **11.2.** Member Associations are responsible for the payment of all fees and expenses in relation to the implementation of the Scheme in their respective territories, except where expressly identified otherwise in these Regulations.
- **11.3.** For the avoidance of doubt, this includes among others all professional (e.g. legal, accounting), banking and monetary exchange costs.

Article 12: INDEMNIFICATION

12.1. Member Associations shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend the AFC, its officers, committee members, other Member Associations, agents, auxiliary persons, representatives, and employees from and against all liabilities, obligations, damages, losses, claims, demands, recoveries, deficiencies, costs or expenses (including without limitation all costs and expenses for withdrawal from the Scheme or a Scheme agreement and/or all attorneys' fees and expenses) which such parties may suffer or incur in connection with, resulting from, or arising out of any breach by the Member Association (including but not limited to its officers, directors, representatives, auxiliary persons, employees or agents) or any act or omission of the Member Association (including its officers, directors, representatives, auxiliary persons, employees or agents) in connection with the performance of its obligations pursuant to these Regulations.

Article 13: DISCIPLINARY MEASURES

13.1. All disciplinary measures in relation to these Regulations shall be undertaken in accordance with the current AFC Statutes, AFC Disciplinary and Ethics Code, and all relevant AFC regulations and circulars.

Article 14: DECISIONS

14.1. All decisions made in accordance with these Regulations, except where expressly identified otherwise, are final and binding and not appealable in accordance with the AFC Statutes.

Article 15: AMENDMENTS

15.1. The AFC reserves the right to make amendments to any part of the Regulations. Such amendments shall be duly communicated in due course.



Article 16: FORCE MAJEURE

16.1. Pursuant to these Regulations, the AFC Technical Committee is the only body capable of declaring a Force Majeure event.

Article 17: MATTERS NOT PROVIDED FOR

17.1. Matters not provided for in these Regulations shall be decided by the AFC Technical Committee. Such decisions are final and binding and not appealable.

Article 18: ENFORCEMENT

18.1. These Regulations were ratified by the AFC Executive Committee on 21 October 2024 and will come into force on 1 November 2024.

Only when a Member Association has been confirmed as a member of the AFC Elite Youth Scheme can it apply for the Validation/Grading of its Academies (i.e. top clubs and national training centres which were not part of the original application).

2. Who Evaluates?

- 1. Member Association Youth Development Programmes: AFC Evaluation
- 2. Member Association High-Performance Centres: AFC Evaluation
- 3. Member Association Recognised Academies (clubs, leagues, etc.): AFC Validation of Member Association Evaluations

3. How many Criteria and Levels?

- Member Association Youth Development Programmes: 11 Criteria and three Levels
- Member Association High-Performance Centres: 20 Criteria and three Levels
- Member Association Recognised Academies: 20 Criteria and three Levels

ONE-STAR

A basic Member Association Youth Programme which includes projects, training and initiatives beyond national team matches



TWO-STAR

A highly-developed youth programme which includes Academy links, elite-player recruitment schemes, domestic leagues, talent centres, etc.



THREE-STAR

A fully-developed youth programme which provides topclass facilities, well-qualified coaches, comprehensive support, regular playing opportunities at an elite level, constant monitoring, high-performance analysis, etc.

3A. AFC ELITE YOUTH SCHEME – THE WHY, HOW AND WHAT

WHY?

To provide your Member Association with Continental recognition for your elite youth programmes and to help you succeed in your efforts to nurture talented footballers. Remember, an endorsement by the AFC will provide a number of benefits for you and your Member Association in relation to licensing, sponsorship, promotion, recruitment and reputation.

HOW?

Your Member Association applies for the AFC's Youth Scheme membership. Enrolment will depend on satisfying the Scheme's 11 Key Criteria. On request, the AFC's Youth Panel will support your application and evaluation process.

WHAT?

An AFC certificate will confirm your Member Association's endorsement and identify your Academies which have been approved at the Continental level through a star system (Three-Star recognition being the highest). Thereafter, you will be authorised to use the AFC's logo to confirm your Youth Scheme status and to aid your work in elite player development.




3C. EVALUATION PROCESS

- 1. Following a process of self-evaluation, the Member Association shall apply for the AFC Elite Youth Scheme endorsement based on the eleven (11) Member Association Core Activities to the AFC via email (tdyouth@the-afc.com).
- 2. The Member Association shall send its supporting documents (a completed Member Association checklist, a brief summary of the Member Association's elite youth programme and Academy information based on the AFC's criteria) within one month of the application date to the AFC via email (tdyouth@the-afc.com).
- 3. Two duly appointed AFC Youth Panel members shall assess the Member Association's application and supporting documentation (to be completed within ten [10] working days of the date of receipt of the material).
- 4. If an assessment visit to a Member Association is required, this shall be completed as soon as possible following the application.
- 5. Upon completing the evaluation, the two AFC Youth Panel members shall send an assessment report to the AFC Youth Panel for their consideration and decision. The decision shall then be communicated to the AFC Technical Committee.
- 6. The AFC Technical Committee shall inform the AFC Executive Committee with regard to all relevant updates concerning the implementation of the Scheme in due course.
- 7. Where the AFC Youth Panel decides to approve a Member Association application, a declaration is signed by both the AFC and the relevant Member Association, and an AFC certificate of approval is sent to the Member Association.
- **8.** The AFC shall publish the Endorsement of the Member Association.

The Member Association may in certain circumstances be permitted to use the applicable AFC Elite Youth Scheme for promotional purposes subject to the relevant AFC regulations, guidelines and instructions. The specifics of such use shall be as determined by the AFC at its sole discretion.

3D. FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. Can a Member Association apply to have its national Academy endorsed?

Yes, if it satisfies the Key Criteria of the Scheme.

2. Can a club apply directly to the AFC for Endorsement?

No. The Scheme is a partnership between the AFC and its Member Associations.

3. When can a Member Association apply for the Scheme Membership?

When it can satisfy the eleven (11) Key Criteria on the elite youth evaluation checklist.

4. Who evaluates/grades the clubs?

The Member Associations (with partners), using these Regulations as reference.

5. What is the difference between Endorsement and membership?

After receiving the Endorsement, a Member Association becomes a Scheme member.

6. Who are the main collaborators in the evaluation process?

The AFC's Youth Panel members and the Member Association's head of youth or technical director.

7. If a Member Association already has an Academy Endorsement project, can this be recognised by the AFC?

A Member Association or a private endorsement project can be used as a reference, but the AFC criteria still has to be satisfied.

8. What happens to a club Academy's Endorsement if the club is relegated from the top league?

The Academy will retain its AFC/Member Association recognition provided that it continues to satisfy the grading criteria.


9. In the context of the Scheme, what is a Member Association elite youth scheme portfolio? The list of approved academies that a Member Association is responsible for.

10. Can a professional league become a member of the Scheme?

No. Only Member Associations can be recognised as members by the AFC, but professional leagues can be involved as active partners.
