

The AFC Futsal Asian Cup™ was successfully held in Kuwait from September 27 to October 8, 2022. The 16th edition of the tournament showed marked improvement in the overall level of competition, with the majority of teams showing great progress in producing high-tempo matches.

Sixteen countries participated in this tournament, which was eventually won by Japan when they defeated the IR Iran. Uzbekistan took third place and Thailand fourth. A total of 32 matches were played and 193 goals were scored by the participating teams.

Hossein Tayebibidgoli from the IR Iran scored 10 goals to clinch the Yili Top Scorer award.

The Most Valuable Player award went to Moslem Oladghobad, who had a major influence on IR Iran's matches and the overall competition. The Best Goalkeeper award was presented to Japan's Guilherme Kuromoto for playing a major role in the Semi-final and Final. The Fairplay award went to Uzbekistan.

The AFC Futsal Asian Cup™ Kuwait 2022 was an exciting and competitive tournament, with good sportsmanship and teamwork shown all around.

# **COMPETITION SUMMARY**

Japan defeated the Islamic Republic of Iran 3-2 to emerge champions of the AFC Futsal Asian Cup™ Kuwait 2022.

It was Japan's fourth title, having previously won in 2006, 2012 and 2014.

The final at the Saad Al Abdullah Hall was the perfect ending to a tournament that made a return after four years due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Japan started the tournament on the wrong foot after suffering a 2-1 defeat to Saudi Arabia in their opening Group D match.

Head coach Kenichiro Kogure's side, however, bounced back in style to defeat Korea Republic 6-0 and Vietnam 2-0 to advance to the Quarter-Finals as Group winners.

IR Iran faced no issues in booking their Knockout Stage spot with Vahid Shamsaee's side cruising to the top of Group C with emphatic wins over Indonesia (5-0), Chinese Taipei (10-1) and Lebanon (9-0).

The Quarter-Finals were another challenge for Japan as they had to come from a goal down to beat Knockout Stage debutants Indonesia 3-2.

IR Iran, meanwhile, enjoyed another trouble-free tie as they cruised 8-1 past Vietnam in their Quarter-Final.









Up next for Japan were an Uzbekistan side who had advanced to the Semi-Finals with four straight wins, and the last four tie lived up to expectations with end-to-end action.

For the second match running, Japan found themselves trailing after Ilkhomjon Khamroev gave Uzbekistan the lead in the first half.

The East Asian side, however, increased their tempo in the second half and were rewarded with goals from Arthur Oliveira and Sora Kanazawa for a 2-1 win and a 10th appearance in the Final.

IR Iran, meanwhile, were too strong for Thailand, with skipper Hossein Tayebi, Mohammadhossein Derakhshani (2 goals) and Moslem Oladghobad (2 goals) scoring in an emphatic 5-0 win.

With Uzbekistan's 8-2 defeat of Thailand in the thirdplace playoff serving as the appetiser, the Final got off to an explosive start with IR Iran pressing against a defensively resilient Japan.

The 12-time champions, however, were finally rewarded for their efforts in the 15th minute when Saied Ahmad Abbasi opened the scoring.

For the third successive match, Japan found themselves trailing but their response was almost immediate, with Kazuya Shimizu drawing them level a minute later.







Japan continued to dominate in the second half but a moment of pure brilliance by captain Oliveira saw the skipper putting his side ahead with a free-kick in the 27th minute.

IR Iran, to their credit, fought back and had it not been for Japan goalkeeper Guilherme Kuromoto's heroics, would have drawn level on several occasions.

Instead, it was Japan who went further ahead when Abbasi inadvertently sent the ball into his own net with 30 seconds left on the clock.

IR Iran pulled one back through Alireza Javan Shahkali but there was no denying Japan a fourth AFC Futsal Asian Cup™ title.



**TECHNICAL POINTS** 

#### **FLYING HIGHER**

With each passing tournament, we have witnessed the rapid and constant evolution of goalkeepers in numerous ways. With better fitness levels and even more polished technique, goalies emerged as huge tactical assets in Kuwait 2022 and decided the fate of several matches.

If we compare Kuwait 2022 with the 2016 edition, most goalkeepers at the latter tournament played very close to their goals, limiting themselves to middle/long shot/stop situations. Only goalkeepers who reached the Semi-Finals showed some consistency in defending and blocking 1v1 GK situations and covering long balls.

But for most of them, contributing to the offensive part of the game was still unfamiliar territory and we barely saw a long and fast throw, with none of them using their feet to support the attacks.

Therefore, 2022 was a milestone moment for Asian goalkeepers, which saw the evolution and establishment of specific techniques.

When their hands were not able to do the job, goalkeepers had no hesitation in using their foot as a resource. On 1v1 GK situations, they clearly showed that they knew the difference between defending a shot at the critical time.

Adopting blocking postures and their variations were an option used by most of them.



The covering reach for long balls was considerably wider than 2016, with many intercepted passes and the goalkeeper acting almost like a second anchor.

Ball distribution was not only limited to putting it back in the game, but became a reliable and truly offensive resource with a great diversity of throws tearing open defensive ranks to create dangerous attacking chances.

It was not limited to perfectly-executed actions, miraculous saves or fewer or even no mistakes, but above all, confirmed the consistency and understanding of the technical and tactical behaviours displayed by most goalkeepers across all matches.

The offensive phase, however, surfaced a completely separate pattern. It was here where the goalkeeper had deeply changed the way the game was played. Originally seen as an excellent defensive position, the priorities in goalkeeper development were mainly focused on goal and space protection and basic offensive foot skills.

It would be a "bonus" for a goalkeeper to possess the talent and foot work of an outfield player and it was only when Colombian custodian Rene Higuita arrived

on the scene that the world was introduced to this concept. The Colombian was a game changer in high-level European league matches where he earned the reputation of being the "Flying Goalkeeper."

Since then, coaches have raised the expectations of the traits required of a goalkeeper. Nimble foot skills have been deemed to serve as the catalyst to drive forward with greater purpose in the attacking build-up and transitions. Through this numerical advantage, they would have a valuable asset eager to escape the opponent's pressing, offer offensive support and break the defensive balance.



In Chinese Taipei four years ago, the use of goalkeepers to escape the defensive pressing and as supporting passing options were already present with many teams. But at Kuwait 2022, 15 of the 16 teams used their goalkeepers for this purpose (only Turkmenistan refrained) while eight teams also used their regular goalkeepers as a deliberate offensive option.

As long as the rules of the game continue to remain the same, the next generation of goalkeepers will have to work to make a difference not only by defending their goal, but also as a crucial offensive weapon.

Most teams seem to understand this importance and have invested in goalkeeper coaches who have largely contributed to the results we now see.

If the saying "the goalkeeper is more than 50% of a good team" is true, this tournament may be a good reason to celebrate the significant progress made in the right direction.

# PLAYER ARCHETYPE: "CITIUS, ALTIUS, FORTIUS"

Some time ago, players used to possess strong and weak points in an inversely proportional ratio.

Some were tall, but not so coordinated. Strong, but heavy or slow. Or small, but to compensate, be fast and skilled. The balance of this diversity was something almost poetic. But when we talk about sports and performance, the Olympic motto "Citius, Altius, Fortius" ("Faster, Higher, Stronger") is key.



Top-level sports demand physical and technical excellence from players. And it is a natural consequence to see these standards increasing as the competition grows.

After each edition of the AFC Futsal Asian Cup<sup>TM</sup>, players have shown that they can be even taller, stronger, faster, more skilled and intelligent. Teams such as the 2018 Lebanon side, the Uzbekistan of 2022 or Iran (both editions) showed it was possible to break this paradigm and create new patterns and demands for high level performances.

These physical standards may set new guidelines to scout players, as in football or volleyball, where players are picked by height. This has not been a priority in futsal until now. Would it influence the scouting and development of the next Generation of players? Are the days of futsal as one of the most democratic sports coming to an end?

### **LOCAL COACHES**

Asia has been assisted for a long time by international coaches. Whether from Brazil, Spain, Argentina, the Netherlands, Portugal or Italy, they came from different parts of the world to contribute to the structure and pillars of futsal in their country of choice. Their legacy is undeniable.

But will Japan's title be a sign that Asian coaches can start walking by themselves?

As a major powerhouse of Asian futsal, Japan for the first time appointed a local head coach: the national legend Kenichiro Kogure. It was not by chance. It is well known that the Japanese are meticulous when it comes to planning. So, it was all part of a long-term project to establish the "Japan Way".


To build a football style based on their own philosophy and identity, Japan sought knowledge from across the world. But they always knew the target was to be completely independent and become a reference point with their new football ideal. It is happening with football. And futsal also has the same vision.

The results may have arrived faster than most optimists would have imagine, but overall, the Asian countries have improved through the years because of the AFC Futsal Coaching Courses, which is part of the AFC Futsal Coach Education Development Plan. The MAs organise more than 100 futsal coaching courses with the assistance of the AFC every year.

### **FUTSAL FOR EVERYONE**

Futsal is already well established throughout Asia and the signs of its growth can be seen not only in the performances at the FIFA Futsal World Cup and the development of local leagues, which attract good coaches and players from around the world, but also in the increasing number of Asian players exported to the best European leagues. None of this happened by chance.

Despite each country having its own vision of planning and development, it is a fact that all of them invested in knowledge by inviting good international coaches, players or by improving their local education programmes.

In this tournament, we not only saw a technical, but a great tactical evolution. In the 2018 edition, only half of the teams were able to play in two offensive systems (3-1 or 4-0). In 2022, 14 of the 18 teams had the option to switch from one system to another.

We could speculate about the reasons for these numbers. One would be the undeniable fact that knowledge has been widespread to the point that the access to system variations and details would not be a secret held by a few experts. Another assumption would be the evolution of the technical/tactical capacity of the players that made this diversity possible.

Whether it is better to use one or two systems is up for discussion. But these numbers could be a sign of a great deepening of the roots of Asian futsal.

This tournament also showed that most teams still prefer zonal defending. But teams who used a mixed or both types of defense slightly increased, among them, champions Japan.



**TALKING POINTS** 


Good technical quality has been the trademark of Japan over the years. The Japanese squad chose to face strong opponents by bringing in different types of players, each with their own physical, tactical and technical specialists. This diversity allowed them to be flexible to the demands of every match. Still the players were used sparringly, such as Shunta Uchimura, who was barely used until the Finals, but surprisingly featured prominently in the decider, which as most likely attributed to his defensive abilities.

Among all individual technical qualities, one in specific was missing: a 1v1 dribbler who could shoot. The two dribblers Japan brought to Kuwait weren't the type of players who offered danger over middle distances as shooters.

Young Sora Kanazawa was efficient, using his speed and sharpened technique on the wings, but as he was mostly used to create chances for the second post, struggled when this option was reduced against Uzbekistan or neutralised in the tie against Saudi Arabia. Kokoro Harada, on the other hand, was not given enough time to prove himself as a middle-distance finisher but showed strong qualities in 1v1 situations.

Japan deployed an aggressive individual defending approach, pressing high in the opponent's half. The players were allowed to switch marking their opponents when necessary, optimising the defensive line height and saving physical stamina. But in the final match against Iran, Japan used a pure man-toman marking approach with a designated opponent to mark, which helped to minimise defensive errors.





Oliveira was the main anchor in nullifying the opponent's threats to play comfortably in depth. In their only defeat, to Saudi Arabia, they played passively when it came to defending the opponent's flying goalkeeper. This allowed the goalkeeper to play freely and find space for the first goal assist. Japan seemed to have learned from this lesson, however, by improving their timing to pressure the flying goalkeeper.


Japan preferred to use 3-1 with a pivot playing as a target man (Antonio Hirata and Kazuya Shimizu) with variations in their opening movements. It naturally ended 4-0 with the pivot returning or goalkeeper support creating a 5v4. Eventually, they also used the 4-0 system.

Balance and tactical needs were key in defining the Japanese team in many aspects. As they tried to maintain a strong pivot to play in depth, there were

also spots reserved for a left-foot player to enhance the quality and probabilities of the successful connection of a 1v1 pass, and a long middle range shooter in each quartet. As mentioned, the management of these values was well-controlled by their head coach.

Japan struggled in their first match against Saudi Arabia when the lack of strikers capable of finding a breakthrough and finishing against a compact defence was visible. Strong 1v1 and good shooting skills were virtues found to be lacking. This may be something for the defending champions to work on in the next edition. Harada and Kanazawa may be natural candidates, but will have to work on their shooting skills over middle and long range distances.

No goals were scored by powerplay, and the style was used only in the first match.







Diversity brings balance. It was the mantra for the Japanese team in many aspects and physical conditioning. They had good power and physically strong players who were also nimble and quick to cover each other.

Player substitution was mainly a full set rotation, with some punctual changes. Besides the goalkeepers, five players stood in the court for more than 20 minutes per match on average: Oliveira, Tomoki Yoshikawa, Hirata, Soma Mizutani and Shimizu, who were players from the Nagoya Oceans Club and proved to be key players owing to their higher standards of physical fitness.

The road to the title showed a variety of different scenarios: falling behind, defending the game and a

defeat (in the very first match). The first match clearly posed questions for this team: would Japan find the mental balance between experience and youth? Could they deal with such pressure?

But the team found its way step by step during this tournament. As the tournament progressed, the confidence and winning attitude of the younger players kept on building right up to the final, where one single mistake against the formidable Iranian side, was punished. These experiences tested the resolve of the team and overcoming these difficulties helped them become stronger.

The goals scored curve showed that in the secondhalf, Japan scored more goals (six in the first-half and 11 in the second), suggesting a slow start but final sprint pattern, a reflection of their path to the title.

Kuromoto apparently started as the main goalkeeper. Still, after the loss in the first match and a clean sheet victory against Korea Republic, Higor Pires rose as the natural choice replacing Kuromoto and performed until the last five minutes of the Semi-final when he unfortunately got injured.


Kuromoto, who replaced the injured Higor Pires, was highly motivated and gave his team one of the most remarkable performances of this tournament. And he repeated it in the Finals, helping his team land the coveted crown.
