**Country:** Kuwait  
**Population:** 3,566,437 (as of 2010)  
**Capital:** Kuwait City

Kuwait City has a population of 2.38 million in the metropolitan area and serves as Kuwait's political and economic capital.

It is located at the heart of the country on the shores of the Persian Gulf, and hosts Kuwait's parliament (Majlis Al-Umma), governmental offices, headquarters of most Kuwaiti corporations and banks.

Kuwait's official language is Modern Standard Arabic. Kuwaiti Arabic, a Gulf Arabic sub-dialect, is Kuwait's colloquial dialect. English is widely understood and often used as a business language.

The Dinar is the currency of Kuwait and was introduced in 1961 to replace the Gulf rupee. It is sub-divided into 1000 fils and is the highest-valued currency unit in the world.

About 85% of the population in Kuwait identify themselves as Muslims.

Among the non-Kuwaiti citizens, the country has a large community of Christians (est. 300,000 to 400,000), Hindus (est. 300,000), Buddhists (est. 100,000), and Sikhs (est. 10,000). Hindus account for the largest number of expatriates in Kuwait.

As the political, cultural and economic center of the emirate, Kuwait City's trade and transportation needs are served by Kuwait International Airport, Mina Al-Shuwaik (Shuwaik Port) and Mina Al Ahmadi (Ahmadi Port).

With the discovery of oil in 1936, the city's standard of living improved dramatically, including health and education services.

Kuwait has the world's fifth largest oil reserves and petroleum products now account for nearly 95% of export revenues and 80% of government income.

A world-class business hub, Kuwait City has an arid climate, with very hot summers, little rainfall, and frequent dust storms.

Summer temperatures range from 38 to 46 degrees Celsius (100 to 115 degrees Fahrenheit). Temperatures over 50 degrees Celsius (122 degrees Fahrenheit) are not uncommon in the summer, especially in heat waves. Winters are much cooler than summer.

Summer rainfall is very rare, and normally non-existent. The wettest month is January, typically with only five days of any rain. Rain may occur in the spring and its frequency increases around November. On average, Kuwait City sees about 22 wet days, and 343 dry days.

Dust storms occur at times during summer from the shamal wind. Dust storms can occur anytime of year but occur mostly during summer, and less frequently during autumn.

Kuwait's booming economy has allowed many international hotel chains to enter agreements to open hotels in the country. By 2012, over 3,000 rooms are expected to be added to Kuwait's current hotel inventory.

The city is also home to a large variety of shopping malls, which serve as the basis of Kuwaiti social life.

In 2008, a railway network connecting Arab states of the Persian Gulf was proposed, although work is yet to start. A metro network was designed, with four lines and stations across the entire city and suburbs. Although it has faced considerable delays, the project is expected to commence construction sometime in 2011 and open parts of the first two lines by July 2016.

Kuwait International Airport is the primary airport for the country serving a wide variety of local and international destinations.





The third edition of the AFC Futsal Club Championship was held in Kuwait City, Kuwait, from July 1-6, 2012.

The venues for the tournament were Yarmouk SC Indoor Stadium and Al Arabi Indoor Stadium.

Eight teams - Yarmouk SC (Kuwait), Nagoya Oceans (Japan), Sanaye Giti Pasand (Iran), All Sports (Lebanon), GH Bank RBAC (Thailand), Thai Son Nam (Vietnam), Ardus (Uzbekistan) and Al Rayyan (Qatar) - qualified for the tournament proper.

Being the host country's club, Yarmouk SC qualified automatically while the representatives from Japan, Iran and Lebanon also received direct entry by virtue of clubs from those countries finishing in the top three places at the previous edition of the tournament.

2011 champions Nagoya Oceans edged Shriker Osaka by a point to win the domestic futsal league to represent Japan in the continental competition.

Sanaye Giti Pasand's dramatic entry into the competition hinged on last-minute calculations, after last year's finalists Shahid Mansouri and Giti Pasand were tied equal on points from 26 matches in the league. Giti Pasand overtook Shahid Mansouri's healthy goal difference in the last match day as they thrashed Persepolis Tehran 11-2 while Shahid Mansouri could only manage a 7-3 win over 2010 champions Foolad Mahan Sepahan.

All Sports also won the grueling best-of-five finals against Sadaka Beirut 3-2 to book a ticket for the finals in Kuwait.

GH Bank RBAC and Thai Son Nam are the winners of Zone 2 qualifiers where GH Bank defeated China's Guangzhou Baiyunshan and Thai

Son Nam beat Indonesia's Pelindo in the semi-finals to qualify for the final. GH Bank ultimately won the tournament after beating Thai Son Nam 1-0.

Likewise, Ardus remained all conquering in the local futsal league with nine wins and one draw in 10 matches of the league to represent Uzbekistan in the Zone 1 qualifier where they once again remained undefeated accumulating 12 points from four matches. Al Rayyan was the other team to join Ardus in Kuwait as they finished second behind Ardus in the qualifiers which was played in a round-robin format.

The inaugural edition of AFC Futsal Club Championship was held in 2010 and ran with nine teams, forming a group of four and five teams each. The top two finishers from each group made it to the semi-finals.

Since 2011, the final tournament is played with eight teams. If more national league champions wish to enter a team, all but the top three finishers of the last tournament and the host nation, have to enter a qualification stage.

Iranian clubs have been a dominant force in the previous continental championships with Foolad Mahan Sepahan winning the inaugural edition in 2010 and Shahid Mansouri missing out the title after conceding an extra-time defeat to Japan's Nagoya Oceans in 2011 in Doha.

Iranian players swooped all individual awards offered in the last two editions of the tournament. Asian futsal icon Vahid Shamsaee (Foolad Mahan Sepahan) completed a double by winning the Most Valuable Player and Top scorer awards in 2010 while compatriot Mohammad Keshavarz (Shahid Mansouri) and Ali Asghar Hassanzadeh (Al Rayyan) continued Iran's domination in 2011.

The teams involved in the AFC Futsal Club Championship 2012 exhibited the quality required to bridge the gap between the well-established national leagues of Europe and South America.

**Football needs Futsal**

Futsal is recognised and utilised by the strong footballing nations as a development tool for players as it improves decision-making, ball mastery and movement. AFC Member Associations are working hard to compete at the continental futsal club competition and looking at the quality of this year championship, credit must be given to their vision and understanding of the game.

It is a fact that futsal can help and assist Asian and world football in creating creative, highly innovating players in the likes of Spain, Brazil and Argentina.

**Restriction of import**

The introduction of high-quality foreign and Asian imports allowed emerging nations to compete against the well-established club teams.

However, emphasis should be made on the restriction of quantity of these players to allow further development of local players and the development pathways set up at each club.

One of the most notable aspects of the emerging countries was the reliance of these imports and the rest periods given. It was a factor at critical moments within each game when matured teams with more depth on the bench were able to win games that were in the balance as their key players have had sufficient recovery time and were able to react quickest to situations.

**Set piece variation**

As set piece opportunities are recognised statistically as 33% of all world futsal goals, a higher percentage of well executed set piece variation was displayed in this tournament. Kudos to the clubs' coaching staff for implementing tactical awareness; credit also goes to the players for their understanding and communication on the field.

Recognition should also be given to the players on their timing, perception and execution of successful set pieces.

**Technical genius**

Highly technical players in 1v1 situations have emerged from this edition of the competition which has increased the quality of each game.

No doubt that quality players and the beauty of futsal bring value to the tournament and attract spectators.

**Modern Futsal**

With the improvement of domestic competitions and increasing number of foreign coaches, high physical level and tempo of each game is evident in the end-to-end, and counter attack to counter attack action.

To cope with the demand of modern futsal, physical training should be improved via tactical integrated training sessions. The evidence of tactical awareness with physical strength was most evident with the stronger club teams in this tournament.

**Expansion**

The 2012 AFC Futsal Club Championship has been highly successful and the rightful winner, Iran's Sanaye Giti Pasand has emerged from the most established national league in Asia.

The tournament should be continued as an annual event and emphasis should be given to increase its popularity and competitiveness.

## COACHES' INFLUENCE



### SET PIECES

Some excellent variations of set pieces were seen in the tournament as a result of extensive practices.

Emphasis should be placed on the quality and timing of execution and the verbal and non-verbal communication between players.

### TACTICS

Coaches with teams involved in stronger and advanced domestic leagues were able to make multiple team changes to counter their opposition attack and defence tactics.

However, coaches within emerging club teams made fewer tactical changes mainly because of lack of maturity and competitiveness of their national leagues with their players lacking of tactical understanding under pressure.

Sound tactical changes enabled the finalists to win vital games in tight encounters.

### SUBSTITUTIONS

Stronger teams utilised all players of the team to share the workload.

Strength throughout the entire squad allowed key players some vital rest for maximum performances. This enabled the core players to react quicker at critical moments to make the slight difference required to tilt the result in their favour.

### POWER PLAY

Set piece interchange and power play options were used by most of the teams in the tournament.

### THE FINAL

The final game of the AFC Futsal Club Championship 2012 was a fitting conclusion to an outstanding tournament in Kuwait with Iranian powerhouse Sanaye Giti Pasand matched against the physically well-prepared team of Uzbekistan's Ardus.

The match as expected started with Sanaye Giti Pasand controlling the early tempo of the game with crisp ball movement assisted by clever support movement and Ardus were happy to wait at halfway with their compact defensive formation.

Sanaye Giti Pasand drew first blood with the brilliant Afshin Kazemi dribbled from a tight position and delivered a square pass which deflected off Artur Yunusov into the back of the net to the surprise of goalkeeper Rustam Umarov.

The opening goal changed the way for the rest of the first period proceeded. Ardus were forced to push higher to put pressure on the opponents and this ball-pressure move enabled them to unsettle the free flowing style of the Iranians.

The turnover in possession resulted in swift counter attacking raids by Ardus who were close on a number of occasions in the first period to equalise only failed by their own inaccurate shooting and tremendous shot stopping from Sanaye Giti Pasand goalkeeper Hossein Hafshejani. Set pieces from both teams were extensive and credit to the coaches who no doubt worked hard on that aspect.

The second period started with a bang and within a minute Ardus equalised. Yunusov fantastically dribbled past two players and goalkeeper Ali Reza Samimi, who replaced teammate Hafshejani at the half time, and a simple side-foot shot was all that was needed.

The game flowed from end to end from then on. The one who took better use of their opportunities will have the the upper hand.

It was Sanaye Giti Pasand again. Rudimar Venancio supplied the finishing touch from a set piece free kick to help the team regain the advantage.

Sanaye Giti Pasand controlled the possession for a long period after scoring their second of the match but the active Ardus were always in the match much to the delight of the vocal crowd.

With three minutes to play Ardus applied their power play option but resolute and desperate defending from Sanaye Giti Pasand enabled them to win the championship for the first time in their history.

## TALKING POINTS



### Local vs foreigner

It was a 4v4 affair. Four local and four foreign coaches provided variation to style and tempo.

### A ≠ Average

Group A consisted of a standout powerhouse and teams from emerging countries with less experienced players although foreign imports enabled these teams to be competitive.



### B for balance

Group B consisted teams from strong domestic leagues providing evenly contested and highly entertaining match-ups.



### Imports' influence

Foreign and Asian imports showed their qualities to improve the overall good quality of the competition with end to end actions.

## RECOMMENDATIONS



### Recharge

There were no day-off between group matches but a day's rest each before semi-finals and final will do the teams a world of good as these matches are very important and need to be top in quality.

The semifinalists/finalists can then refresh themselves and fully recover from their previous gruelling matches.



### Playoff

The 5th-6th and 7th-8th playoff should be played to add valuable experiences to coaches, players and referees.

These matches are valuable to all parties concerned especially the club teams, who mostly travel from far for the competition.

# MATCH DAY 1



## Group B: All Sports 3-3 (1-1) GH Bank RBAC

The AFC Futsal Club Championship started with a bang with Thai champions GH Bank playing an entertaining 3-3 draw against Lebanon's All Sports in the Group B opener.

In the see-saw battle, All Sports came twice from behind while GH Bank also managed to bounce back in the match after going down 2-1 just after the half time. Both side saw a player each getting a red card.

Panomkorn Saisorn, Kritsada Wongkaeo and Panuwat Janta scored for GH Bank while Willian Neris, Kassem Kawsan and Ali El Homsy were on the scoresheet for the Lebanon champions.

## Group B: Nagoya Oceans 3-4 (1-1) Ardus

Dilshod Irsaliev struck a brace as Uzbek giants Ardus stunned defending champions Nagoya Oceans 4-3 in a thrilling encounter.

A goal down after just 13 seconds into the match, the Uzbeks hit back with Irsaliev's brace and a goal each from captain Andrey Shlema and Carmelo Hernandez.

Oceans' goals came from the ever-present Kaoru Morioka, Tomoki Yoshikawa and Rafael Henmi.

## Group A: Sanaye Giti Pasand 8-0 (2-0) Thai Son Nam

Iranian champions Sanaye Giti Pasand showed their intent in the tournament after demolishing Vietnamese debutant Thai Son Nam 8-0 in their first match.

Thai Son Nam had some early chances of their own but they could not hold on to the persistent pressures from the Iranian side and tamely unfolded in the second half.

Spanish import Rudimar Venancio, Afshin Kazemi and Ahmad Esmailpour scored a brace apiece while Shahram Sharifzadeh and Hamidreza Yousefi also grabbed a goal each.

Thai Son Nam had their moments in the first half and early in the second half but poor finishing in the final third let them down.

## Group A: Yarmouk SC 3-5 (2-3) Al Rayyan

Qatar's Al Rayyan capped an exciting first day of the AFC Futsal Club Championship with a highly entertaining 5-3 win over the hosts Yarmouk SC.

Radi Shamari scored a brace for the winners. Antonio Vadillo, Akira Minamoto and Ali Al Sabah also put their names on the scoresheet.

Thiago Gabriel tried to rescue Yarmouk with two beautifully taken goals but that was not enough. Hamad Alawadhi netted another goal for the home team.

## MATCH DAY 2



### Group B: Arduş 2-6 (1-0) All Sports

Debutants Lebanon's All Sports shocked Uzbekistan's Arduş 6-2 to go atop the Group B table.

Fresh from their win over defending champions Nagoya Oceans, there were high expectations from the perennial under achievers Arduş this time around but All Sports dashed their hopes in the last minute of the match by scoring three times.

Khaled Takaji and Ali El Homsy scored two goals apiece with other goals came from Ali Tneich and Spaniard Rafael Marques.

Arduş' goals were scored by Andrey Shlema and Brazilian Carmelo Hernandez.

### Group B: GH Bank RBAC 2-5 (2-3) Nagoya Oceans

Defending champions Nagoya Oceans recovered from their opening match defeat against Uzbekistan's Arduş by collecting all three points against Thai champions GH Bank following a 5-2 win.

Peruvian forward Kaoru Morioka scored a first half double while Tomoki Yoshikawa added one more before the break. Tomoaki Watanabe and Wataru Kitahara also grabbed a goal apiece.

GH Bank replied through Panomkorn Saisorn and Suphawut Thueanklang.

### Group A: Al Rayyan 0-7 (0-5) Sanaye Giti Pasand

Iran's Sanaye Giti Pasand recorded yet another one-sided victory with a thumping 7-0 win over Qatar's Al Rayyan.

Giti Pasand, who downed Vietnamese debutant Thai Son Nam 8-0 in the first match, went five goals ahead in the first half.

Afshin Kazemi continued his fine run with a double strike while teammates Ahmad Esmailpour, Hamidreza Yousefi and Sajjad Bandi notched a goal each.

The unlucky Al Rayyan conceded two own goals to complete the scoreline.

### Group A: Thai Son Nam 0-6 (0-1) Yarmouk SC

Hamad Hayat fired two goals as the local supporters finally had something to cheer about after Yarmouk eased through a 6-0 win over Vietnam's Thai Son Nam to revive their semi-finals hope.

Hayat scored a brace while Abdulrahman Altawail had a hand in Yarmouk first goal and created two chances to dash the hopes of debutant Thai Son Nam who conceded 14 goals and failed to score in their first two matches.

An own goal from Nguyen Bao Quan broke the deadlock just a minute before the halftime. Ahmad Hamid made it 2-0 in the 24th minute.

Hayat grabbed his brace in the 31st and 38th minute after Altawail netted Yarmouk's second a minute before the half an hour mark.

Hamad Alawadhi also notched one for the home team.

# MATCH DAY 3



## Group B: Nagoya Oceans 5-2 (2-0) All Sports

Defending champions Nagoya Oceans recovered from the first day loss to Ardus by booking a place in the semi-finals after defeating Lebanon's All Sports 5-2.

With Ardus winning their match against Thai side GH Bank, Nagoya have qualified as the group runners-up.

All Sports, despite playing good futsal in all three matches, will go home early having seen one win, one draw and one defeat in the campaign.

Rafael Henmi and Tomoki Yoshikawa fired doubles for the Japanese champions while Kenichiro Kogure netted his first goal of the tournament.

Another Japanese, Bruno Hatakeyama was the only All Sports player to score as their second goal came from an own goal by Oceans' goalkeeper Hisamitsu Kawahara.

## Group B: GH Bank RBAC 2-9 (1-2) Ardus

Dilshod Irsaliev scored four goals as Ardus entered into the semi-final finishing Group B winner with a convincing 9-2 win over Thai champions GH Bank.

Jamoliddin Sharipov and Carmelo Hernandez scored a brace with goalkeeper Rustam Umarov also joining the demolition act with a goal one minute before the final whistle.

GH Bank's goals were scored by captain Panomkorn Saisorn and Carlos Silva.

## Group A: Yarmouk SC 1-5 (0-1) Sanaye Giti Pasand

Ahmad Esmailpour scored a hattrick as Sanaye Giti Pasand set up a mouth watering semi-final clash against defending champions Nagoya Oceans with a 5-1 victory over the hosts Yarmouk in the last match of Group A.

Giti Pasand won all their matches to top the table with Al Rayyan came second.

Apart from Esmailpour's hattrick, Sajjad Bandi and Saeid Taghizadeh also notched a goal apiece for the Iranian champions.

Brazilian import Thiago Gabriel grabbed a consolation goal for the home team.

## Group A: Thai Son Nam 2-2 (1-1) Al Rayyan

Qatari champion Al Rayyan managed to book a berth in the last four after playing a fighting 2-2 draw against Group A rock-bottom side Thai Son Nam of Vietnam.

Amro Mohssein and Ali Al Sabah were on the target for Al Rayyan while Thai Son Nam finally found the back of opponents net only in their third match of the competition with Phung Trong Luan and Le Quoc Nam scored a goal each.

Knowing that a point would be enough for them to secure a passage to the semi-final, Al Rayyan were happy to stay less adventurous in the later part of the match.

### SEMI-FINALS

#### SF1: Sanaye Giti Pasand 6-3 (2-1) Nagoya Oceans

Sanaye Giti Pasand continued Iranian clubs' tradition of playing in the final of the AFC Futsal Club Championship after edging defending champions Nagoya Oceans 6-3 in a thrilling semi-final.

Ahmad Esmailpour scored a hatrick taking his personal tally to nine goals in the tournament. Also scored for the Iranians were Afshin Kazemi, captain Mohammad Keshavarz and goalkeeper Ali Reza Samimi.

For Oceans, captain Shuta Mori, Tomoki Yoshikawa and Kaoru Morioka scored a goal apiece.

#### SF2: Ardus 3-1 (1-0) Al Rayyan

Artur Yunusov came back from a long injury layoff to score a vital semi-final goal as Ardus set up a final clash against Iran's Sanaye Giti Pasand with a convincing 3-1 win over Qatari outfit Al Rayyan.

Apart from Yunusov, Dilshod Irsaliev continued his brilliant form by scoring a goal to take his personal tally to seven in the tournament before Shuhrat Tojiboev wrapped up the match one minute before full time with a solo effort.

Saad Bilal broke the duck for Al Rayyan.

### THIRD-PLACE MATCH

#### Nagoya Oceans 4-1 (2-1) Al Rayyan

Japanese champions Nagoya Oceans defeated Qatar's Al Rayyan 4-1 to finish third in the tournament.

The member association of the playoff winner will have the luxury of getting a direct berth in the 2013 finals.

Al Rayyan, who were defeated in the semi-final and went on to miss the third-place last year, had the same fate again and the next year's Qatari champions will have to feature in the qualifiers to make into the tournament proper.

Rafael Henmi scored a brace while Wataru Kitahara and skipper Shuta Mori also notched a goal each for the Japanese.

Al Rayyan's replied through Spanish import Antonio Vadillo, who was sent off late in the match.

### FINAL

#### Sanaye Giti Pasand 2-1 (1-0) Ardus

Sanaye Giti Pasand were crowned AFC Futsal Club Championship 2012 champions after a hard-fought 2-1 victory over Uzbekistan's Ardus at the Yarmouk Indoor Stadium.

This marked the second time Iranians club has captured the coveted title after Sepahan won the inaugural championship in 2010.

A deflected goal off Artur Yunusov from Afshin Kazemi's effort gave the Iranian champions an early 1-0 lead in the 3rd minute. Yunusov made amend by level the score within seconds of the second half.

Brazilian Rudimar Venancio emerged hero for Sanaye Giti Pasand with the championship winning goal in the 24th minute.

Parallel with the rapid and progressive technical development of the game of futsal as well as the increase in number of participation in the championship, AFC endeavors with paramount importance that no stone is left unturned in the protection of player's health as well as to ensure fair play.

**MEDICAL INFRASTRUCTURE**

With the excellent support and cooperation of the LOC Medical Committee led by Dr. Shakeer M Al-Maghrabi and Dr. Waleed H. Al-Anezi, the medical services and infrastructure were in place for the championship as per international standard. AFC appointed Dr. Paisal Chantarapitak and Dr. Halim Bin Mokhtar, members of the elite panel of Medical Officers, to oversee the medical aspects and doping control implementation for the tournament. The AFC Medical Officers were satisfied with the infrastructure and warm services provided to the teams and officials in and out of the field.

**DOPING CONTROL**

In line with AFC's continuous fight against doping to ensure fair play, doping control was carried out in 10 matches involving 20 players. One player per team in each of the 10 matches was randomly drawn for doping testing. Nineteen (19) samples have been reported to be negative with one sample requiring further management.

The cooperation of the team doctors and team physiotherapists in the conduct of the doping control were admirable.


**COMPARISON WITH FOOTBALL**

Correlating the injuries in futsal with football based on the statistics, there were less numbers of injuries in Futsal than football but the severity of the injuries in futsal was high. The reason being is the area of the playing field is small than outdoor football on which the players covered shorter distance but required fast movement and sudden maneuvers.

**INJURIES SUSTAINED BY FUTSAL PLAYER**

As part of the on-going collaboration with F-MARC in assessing injuries in AFC tournaments which commenced in 1998, the team physicians and team physiotherapists were asked to report all injuries sustained by the players during training and matches as well as the illnesses suffered by the players during the tournament. The importance of the role of the team physician in recording the injuries and illnesses was explained during the pre-competition medical coordination meeting held on 30th June 2012. The significance of accurate recording was emphasized as data gathered shall be compiled as scientific evidence to support the development of programs in injury prevention. The level of cooperation was commendable as 100% compliance was achieved.

For this edition of the Futsal Club Championship, seventeen (17) injuries in the 16 matches have been reported. The injury ratio is 1.06 and severity of 2.94 whereby team physicians reported a combined of 50 days absence of player to play due to injuries. Two players suffered Medial Collateral Ligament (MCL) injury of the knee which does not permit the players to continue to play in the succeeding matches. From the seventeen (17) injuries, the locations are; knee (41.2%), thigh (17.6%), lower back (11.8%) and one case each on groin, ankle, foot, hip and the clavicle. The most frequent diagnoses were sprain, strains and contusion.



The summary of the injuries collected from 2010 to 2012 in the AFC Futsal Club Championship is shown in the above diagram. In 2011, the highest rate of severity due to players sustaining major injuries was recorded because of one case of ACL injury that required the player to be absent in play for 90 days. The number of 30 injuries in 2010 are due to more matches were conducted with 10 clubs participating.

## CONTINUOUS KNOWLEDGE ENHANCEMENT IS IMPORTANT



The pre-medical coordination meeting which was held on 30th June 2012 was also a routine activity of the AFC Medical Department to provide updates on the current regulation and development in doping control and football medicine. It was also a good opportunity for the LOC Medical Committee to explain the local medical services prepared for the team with Dr. Shakeer M. Al Al-Maghrabi, LOC Medical Officer delivering the presentation.

The AFC Medical Officer presented topics on doping control procedure, therapeutic use exemption updates, and the WADA prohibited list. The team doctors and team physiotherapists were overwhelmed and extremely pleased with the new knowledge and updates.

## INTRODUCTION



This tournament is the 3rd edition of AFC Futsal Club Championship, the 1st championship was held in Esfahan, Iran in 2010 and 2nd championship was held in Doha, Qatar.

This year, 2 final championships were being held, the first being AFC Futsal Championship UAE that was held in May 2012.

Total, 12 futsal referees were appointed for this championship. From the 12 referees, 5 were the best performance futsal referees from the previous tournament. We also appointed 3 futsal referees who were in the first year in AFC Elite Futsal Referees list as this is good opportunity for them to learn and enhance their experiences from the Referee Instructors and senior colleagues during the tournament.

### FUTSAL REFEREE INSTRUCTORS

The two (2) Futsal Referee Instructors appointed were:

1. Adrian Alaxander Tamplin (AUS)
2. Andy Wong Po On (HKG)

The Futsal Referee Instructors also assisted as Assessors. Their responsibilities were to assess, support and guide them on how to improve their performance at this tournament. They assessed the performances of appointed Referees for the matches and then submit comprehensive reports to AFC for future selections of AFC/FIFA competitions.

### FUTSAL REFEREES

Total of twelve (12) Futsal Referees and two (2) stand-by Futsal Referees were appointed during this tournament. The stand-by referees were appointed to replace any of the main futsal referees if they failed the fitness test.

However, Boratov Vadim (TKM) could not accept this appointment as he was injured days before the Championship. He was replaced by Al Haddad Mohamad (KUW) accordingly.

## PREPARATORY COURSE



The aim of the Preparatory Course was to provide the Referees with an overview and revision on the application and interpretation on the Futsal Laws of the Game. Useful discussions on the previous match analysis and presentations by the Instructors had added a lot to referees' knowledge. Two sessions of Preparatory Course were conducted on 29th & 30th June 2012. Referees were urged to be committed, courageous and be consistent when they perform on the pitch.

## FITNESS TEST



The fitness test for the Futsal Referees was conducted on 29th June 2012 at Al Salmiya SC Stadium at 1930 hrs. All twelve (12) main referees and one (1) stand-by referee passed the fitness test requirements. The fitness test was conducted by appointed Futsal Referee Instructors. The medical team and ambulance provided by Kuwait FA were also present to assist us.



**PRACTICAL TRAINING SESSION**



The practical training session during the preparatory course was conducted on 30th June 2012, 1400 hrs at Al Yarmouk Stadium. The Communication System was used during the training session. They are able to practice and rehearse their movements and signals using the communication sets and thus able to have better teamwork and understanding. The training session was a success as it enables the referees to perform better in actual matches.

## DEBRIEFINGS

Daily debriefings were also conducted by the Referee Instructors on the next day of every match except during the Final Match Day where the debriefing took place right after the match.

During the daily debriefings, a general and yet extensive overviews of the match were given by Referee Instructors, where many match incidents edited after each match were shown, discussed and analyzed.

In these sessions, Referees also talked about their matches and their performances and the instructors will brief them on their strengths and areas where the referees can improve.

Referees were also able to learn from their mistakes and mistakes of their colleagues and their strengths were emphasized.

Each session lasted for an hour's and ended with advises to the referees for further improvement.

## REFEREEING PERFORMANCE

The overall performances of the Referees were very good, due to the daily debriefings and they did improve after every match. Their decisions were consistent and most of their decisions were well received and accepted by the players/teams. It is glad to report that there were no major mistakes committed by the referees.

However, the instructors identified some areas for development such as players' management, technical areas' management and recognition of fouls and all these were rectified and emphasize before the start of the match.



## **REFEREEING APPOINTMENT**

Basically, the referees were each given an opportunity to officiate a few matches before the instructors decide on the other appointments. Referees were later appointed based on their current performance.

During the semi finals, three (3) referees were released and nine (9) referees stay for the semi finals, 3rd/4th placing and final matches.

All appointments were discussed thoroughly by the instructors and forwarded to AFC Referees Department office for review before finalizing the appointment and distributed to the referees and the Competition staff.



## **STRENGTH**

Their support to each other was commendable. Each referee knows their responsibility well and other issues such as organization of administration, arrival, training, debriefing etc. were well coordinated. On the pitch, their interpretation on the Laws of the Game was good.

## **AREAS FOR FURTHER DEVELOPMENT**

There were small numbers of futsal referees that need more match exposures for them to be able to learn more. With much exposures and experiences, they have the potential to excel further.

However, some referees need to improve their English language to enhance their level of understanding and also to have better communication with each other.

## **CONCLUSION**

Because of the Preparatory Course and the daily debriefings, the referees' understanding and the decisions on matters on the Laws of the Game was good. As they were committed and have made preparations in their countries, their physical fitness level had also met with our expectations.

The Referee Instructors were well-experienced personalities and the referees for this tournament had received the best lecturing and feedback sessions during this tournament.

Due to this, the refereeing performance was on a high level and their knowledge and the performance improve on each match they officiated.

Overall, the referees have developed and enhanced themselves into higher level through this tournament.
