GENERAL • HOST CITY INFORMATION



Rich in culture and heritage, Nanjing, has a special place in Chinese history. The city served as the capital of China for several Chinese Dynasties and the Republic of China.

Located in the lower Yangtze River Drainage Basin and Yangtze River Delta economic zone, the capital of Jiangsu province is a busy city of over eight million people, and is known for being a national centre of trade and commerce, research, education, transportation, and tourism in Eastern China second only to Shanghai.

The blending of its cultural sites and natural spots makes Nanjing a popular destination for visitors. Among the notable places to see are the Confucius Temple, the

mausoleum of Dr. Sun Yat-Sen and the Xuanwu Lake.

With its first class sports facilities, Nanjing has also become a major sports destination and was the host of the country's Third National Cities Sports Games in 1995. This was followed by the hosting of the 10th National Games of the People's Republic of China where they emerged top with the most number of gold medals. Nanjing then hosted the AFC U16 Women's Championship in 2011 and the 2nd Asian Youth Games in 2013.

Nanjing is constantly keeping up with the times and now offers an open environment to visitors and investors around the world.



GENERAL • TOURNAMENT OVERVIEW



The AFC Women's U-16 Championship is the confederation's competition for the Under-16 Women's national teams and is held once every two years. It also serves as the qualifiers for the FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup with the top three teams having the right to represent the AFC in the FIFA tournament.

For the AFC Women's U-16 Championship 2013, there were 12 teams as compared to six teams in 2011. Japan, DPR Korea, China and Korea Republic, who were the top four teams in the 2011 edition of the championship, automatically qualified. Jordan and Iran from the West, Uzbekistan and IR Iran from South & Central, Australia and Thailand from ASEAN and Chinese Taipei and Guam from the East qualified by emerging as winners and

runners-up of the geographically-based group qualifiers held in 2012.

The 12 teams were divided into four groups with the top team from each group progressing to the knock-out stage. Japan, winners of the 2011 championship, upstaged DPR Korea via a penalty shoot-out in the final match to successfully defend their crown. China placed third by defeating Thailand thanks to another penalty shoot-out. Japan, DPR Korea and China are AFC's representatives at the FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup 2014 in Costa Rica.

The 2013 final tournament was staged by China, host nation for the 2011 championship, in Nanjing from 26 September – 6 October. Group A and D matches were

held at the Jiangning Sports Centre while Group B and C matches were held at the Jiangsu Football Training Base Stadium. The knock-out stage matches were all played at the Jiangning Sports Centre.

The 10 referees and twelve assistant referees appointed for the matches passed the fitness test conducted two days before the start of the competition. Doping control was also implemented as a way of educating the young players about the dangers of doping. Injury surveillance was also conducted as a source for future studies in sports medicine.

TOURNAMENT ANALYSIS • TECHNICAL ANALYSIS

The fifth edition of the AFC U-16 Women's Championship was the first time that 12 national teams had competed in the final competition, this compared to six teams in 2007 and 2011 and eight in 2009.

This provided an opportunity for the emerging countries in women's football to play against stronger teams which, in effect, showed their level of football which will now be their basis for creating programmes for its further development.

Australia, China, Korea DPR, Korea Republic, Japan and Thailand who all competed in the last three editions of the competition, were joined by first timers Bahrain, IR Iran, Guam, Jordan, and Uzbekistan and second timer Chinese Taipei.

Due to their lack of experience and maturity in the game, the first timers who faced Japan, Korea DPR, China, and Australia in the group stage were overwhelmed technically and tactically.

Based on their performances in the competition, the teams can be categorized into four levels as follows:

- Japan & DPR Korea
- China, Thailand, Australia, Korea Republic
- Chinese Taipei, IR Iran, Jordan, Uzbekistan,
- Guam, Bahrain

Japan, DPR Korea and China will be the representatives of Asia in the FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup Costa Rica 2014 after placing first, second and third, respectively.

TEAM FORMATIONS

The preferred team formation was 1-4-2-3-1 with Japan, China, Australia, Guam, Jordan, Chinese Taipei, and Thailand having used this formation with two players acting as screeners in front of the back four and three midfielders supporting the lone striker.

DPR Korea, Korea Republic and Uzbekistan used the standard 1-4-4-2 formation. Bahrain relied on the 1-4-1-4-1 formation while IR Iran's 1-4-1-3-2 dominantly showed in their match versus Guam.



From the basic team formation, teams demonstrated a flexibility to employ different formations depending on the strength of their opponents. Teams switched to 1-4-3-3, 1-4-2-4, 1-2-4-4 and 1-3-3-4 formations to have more attacking players when in attack, and to 1-4-5-1, 1-5-4-1, 1-4-4-1-1 and 1-5-3-2 to have more players when in defence.

IN ATTACK

Different styles of attacking play were seen in the tournament because the standards of the team varied greatly.

When playing against stronger teams, weaker teams resorted to counter-attacking, or, at times, to direct-play to the striker or strikers, depending on the team formation.

Japan demonstrated in all their matches the combination of short, quick one-touch and two-touch passing, and long forward or across field passes which were mostly successful due to the excellent off the ball movement of players.

DPR Korea generally used passes across the field, maximizing width to open the opponent's defence and to look for penetrative passes through the centre or through the flanks, in order to get behind the defenders for the cross.

Although there were a lot of goals scored, this was due to Japan, DPR Korea, China, and Australia playing against the competition's first timers during the group stage. There was still a lack of creating clear scoring chances and clinical finishing when they played against teams who are of the same level.



IN DEFENSE

Due to the varied quality of the teams, defending styles also varied from match to match. When teams played against stronger opponents, they were forced to defend deep for most of the match.

The better teams worked as a team, employing immediate pressurizing defence when the ball was lost in the attacking third to regain possession quickly. If the situation was not ripe for high pressurizing defence, they dropped back to make the middle third the area of confrontation with the team being compact in terms of depth and width, and with the goalkeeper positioning himself at the edge or beyond the edge of the penalty to prevent or manage balls played behind the defence as well as to receive back passes.

Some teams lacked collective action in defending whereby one or two players initiated action to regain possession, but the rest of team did not provide defending support. In contrast, Japan and Korea DPR showed emphatic discipline in defending as a team.

Of the 12 teams, only Uzbekistan employed five players in defence with a sweeper and having this free player in defence helped them to contain the offensive incursions of Korea Republic to achieve a draw. The rest of the teams relied on the flat back four.

GOALKEEPING

Goalkeepers of the weaker teams could only do so much to prevent goals when they played against the strong teams. On the other hand, the goalkeepers of the stronger teams have shown their ability to perform during their matches against opponents of the same level or higher.

All goalkeepers have shown their ability to support the team while in possession, to receive back passes, to switch plays or to simply clear the ball to put the team out of danger from attacking opponents. They have also demonstrated confidence to position themselves at the edge of or even beyond the penalty area when their team is attacking or applying pressurizing defence in the opponents' half to be ready to deal with long balls played behind the defenders.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FUTURE DEVELOPMENT

- Review the competition format as there was great disparity between teams in the finals which resulted in lopsided wins in the group stage. The change in format should ensure more competitive matches for the stronger teams who are vying for slots in the FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup.
- Focus on improving the ability to create scoring chances and finishing.
- Improve defending against opponents playing high balls.
- Develop flexibility in tactical formation to be able to play against teams at a world level.
- Improve creativity in the game to have more solutions for different challenges posed by playing against teams with different styles.
- For the weaker teams, more focus on the development of individual technique to keep possession under pressure, improve awareness to help them make good decisions quicker, and enhance their understanding of their roles to have a coordinated and disciplined defence.
- MAs to look into providing the young girls with better coaching and playing opportunities domestically and internationally.



TOURNAMENT ANALYSIS • STORY OF THE TOURNAMENT

GROUP STAGE

Group A

Host nation China lived up to their billing as the top seed in the group as they overwhelmed newcomer Bahrain technically and tactically to win 17-0 in their opening match at the Jiangning Sports Centre with Liu Yan (9) leading the scorers with five goals.

Having barely recovered from their loss against China, Bahrain then faced Australia, another tough opponent. Australia capitalized on their combination passing and physical strength to record a convincing 8-0 win against Bahrain. Australia's introduction of Sunny Franco (10) in the second half changed the complexion of Australia's attack which resulted in four more goals and Franco scoring a hat-trick.

China needed only a draw to reach the semi-finals, but still they played to win. Australia, needing to win the game to assure their place in the knock-out stages, came out gamely and almost scored from two early, counter-attacking chances, when China's goalkeeper, Peng Shimeng (18), erred when dealing with the long ball behind their back four. China, unfazed by these early lapses, stepped up their passing game which resulted in two goals from inside the goal area within the space of five minutes. Leading 2-0, China switched their pace of attack, with more passing from midfield and defence in a bid to invite Australia to open up and to look for the best option to create scoring opportunities. Australia, whenever they gained possession, changed to a quick attacking play with a direct pass to their striker. The persistence of Australia coupled with the waning energy of China resulted in scoring opportunities, but a lack of clinical finishing saw Australia fail to score. China held on to win the match 2-0 and moved through to the semi-finals.



Group B



DPR Korea, runners-up in the 2011 edition of the competition, started their title campaign against Jordan at the Jiangsu Football Training Base Stadium. DPR Korea dominated the match by controlling possession in the midfield zone and creating space through switches of play. DPR Korea's two strikers, Ri Hae Yon (10) and Wi Jong Sim (19) were able to find space with clever movements. Jordan found it difficult to prevent shots on goal, although their goalkeeper Malak Khaled Abed Shannak (1) was unyielding and made a number of saves. DPR Korea scored four goals in the first half and two goals in the second half to win 6-0.

The second group match pitted Chinese Taipei against Jordan. Chinese Taipei started the game strongly and dominated possession and shots on goal enabling them to lead 2-0 at half-time with goals from Pan Shin-Yu (19) and Yang Chia Hui (15). Jordan made some tactical adjustments for the second half, pushing Zean Matthar Adel Bello (3) into a forward position. Jordan showed more confidence and attained an even share of possession and defended well, thwarting Chinese Taipei's efforts to score another goal. Their persistence was rewarded with a goal by Manar Mohammad Mahmoud Isleem (10) in the 88th minute, but Chinese Taipei kept their composure to win the match 2-1.

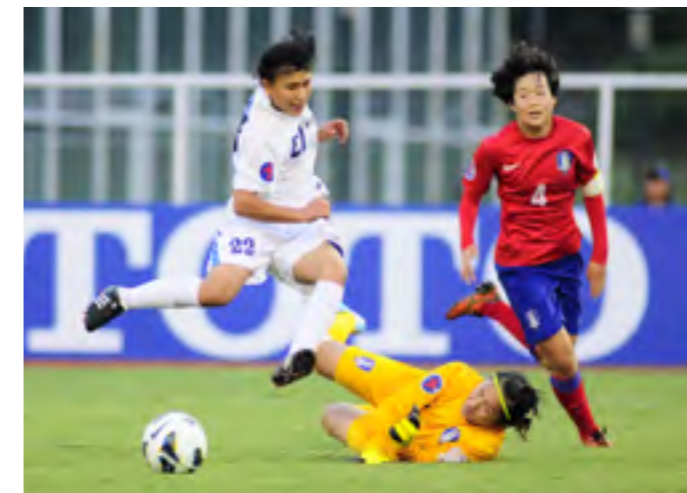
With only one day of rest following their match against Jordan, Chinese Taipei faced title contenders DPR Korea in the last group match. Chinese Taipei battled hard all match, but found the going difficult. DPR Korea stamped their class by dominating the match from start to finish. They showed a maturity to their game with a controlled build-up, good use of wing play and assured combination play to win 10-0, with striker Sung Hyang Sim (11) scoring a hat-trick. DPR Korea progressed to the semi-finals.

Group C

While the opening matches of the other three groups had goals galore, the first group match between Uzbekistan and 2009 champions Korea Republic resulted in a scoreless draw. The first half was relatively even with few scoring chances for either team. Korea Republic had a greater share of possession (59%) although Uzbekistan had the best opportunity of the half with a one on one chance that was cleared by the retreating Korean defenders. Uzbekistan started the second half by applying more pressure to the Koreans, enabling them to have more possession than they did in the first half. Korea Republic pressed hard for the winning goal with five shots on-goal compared to the one shot on-goal by Uzbekistan, but without success.

Thailand capitalized on the effects of the hard-fought scoreless draw between Uzbekistan and Korea Republic two days earlier. With team captain Chuchuen Sudarat (9) orchestrating their attack, Thailand attacked the Uzbekistan goal relentlessly throughout the match to score in the 15th, 37th and 68th minutes to win 3-0 and end Uzbekistan's campaign.

Needing a draw to progress to the semi-finals, Thailand battled with tournament favourites Korea Republic throughout the last group match, with goalkeeper Sutthiboon (18) making a number of crucial saves. Korea Republic took the lead courtesy of Lee Sohee (10) through a penalty kick awarded after a corner in the 67th minute. However, Thailand drew level when Chuchuen Sudarat (9) scored from a corner kick in 80th minute. Korea Republic took the lead again with a header from Lee Sohee (10) in the 85th minute but Chuchuen Sudarat (9) made the most of a weak back pass to claim the ball on the edge of the 18 yard box and put the game back on parity by finishing past goalkeeper Lee Chaebin (1) in the third minute of added time. With the draw, Thailand progressed to the semi-finals for the first time.



Group D



Japan began their defence of the continental title by emphatically overpowering newcomers Guam, 19-0 in the opening group match at the Jiangning Sports Centre. It was totally an attacking game for Japan and a defending game for Guam. Guam's gallant defending made it hard for the first 15 minutes for Japan. With their fantastic passing and movement without the ball enabling them to create the goalscoring chances, Japan eventually broke the deadlock in the 16th minute and duly opened the floodgates. Eight Japanese players scored, with Rikako Kobayashi (7) leading the goal scorers with five goals.

IR Iran, also making their championship debut, attacked and defended aggressively against Guam in the second group match. IR Iran dominated the first half but could not find a way to defeat Guam's goalkeeper Mya Jade Sanchez (1) until two minutes into first-half stoppage-time when Shabnam Behesht (7) scored from a rebound. IR Iran scored again in the 55th minute from a direct free-kick. Guam tried to get back in the game by switching to a 1-3-4-3 formation by moving midfielder Paris Francine Blas (7) to the forward position but to no avail. IR Iran held on to win 2-0.

Japan cemented their place in the semi-finals by thrashing IR Iran, 9-0 in the last group match. Employing their excellent passing, good combination play and defence splitting passes in front of 18 yard box, as well as their high pressurizing defence immediately after losing the ball in the attacking third, Japan led IR Iran, 6-0 after the first half. The second half saw IR Iran playing more aggressively which caused problems for the Japanese players. Nevertheless, Japan still managed to score three goals.

SEMI-FINALS

China vs DPR Korea, 1-3



DPR Korea started the better of the two teams and created a number of chances early in the first half. With the continued pressure taking its toll on China, DPR Korea capitalized by scoring two goals - in the 35th minute from a free-kick, and in the 41st minute, after a defensive error by China - to lead, 2-0 at half-time. China changed their style in the second half, playing more directly and attacking with greater intensity. They made the most of a goalkeeping error to finish an indirect free-kick inside the penalty area in the 66th minute. DPR Korea also changed tactics and formation (1-4-2-3-1) when they brought in Sung Hyang Sim (11) for Ju Hyo Sim (9). This brought a new creative threat and Hyang Sim was involved in the third and final goal for DPRK which saw Ri Hae Yon (10) to score her second goal. It was a deserved win for DPR Korea, and one which guaranteed them a place in the FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup in Costa Rica in 2014.

3rd and 4th Placing

China PR v Thailand, 2-2, 4-2 PSO



A truly dramatic game saw China win via a penalty shoot-out, to finish third in the championship and secure a place at the FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup 2014 in Costa Rica.

China started aggressively which caused problems in the Thailand defence especially down the left hand side of China's attack. China's efforts were rewarded when they grabbed the lead after a defence splitting pass put

Thailand v Japan, 0-6

Japan completely dominated this match against Thailand who were prevented from registering a single shot during the 90 minutes. Thailand defended bravely in the first half and frustrated Japan who, nevertheless were still able to score two goals. Japan continued their attacking play in the second half with Thailand again defending deeply. However, on winning the ball, Thailand lacked the energy to construct effective attacks and get numbers forward. Thailand's goalkeeper, Sutthiboon (18), had a good match, coming out bravely to deny Japan on a number of occasions. However, the constant movement and penetrative passing play of Japan wore down the Thailand defence and there was a flurry of three goals at the end of the match. Japan's captain, Sugita (10), had a commanding game in midfield with intelligent passing and movement as did striker Kobayashi (7) who caused problems with her runs into space behind the defence. Both scored two goals each and had an assist for the game. With the victory, Japan booked a place in the FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup in Costa Rica in 2014.



Liu Yan (9) through on goal which she finished well past the oncoming goalkeeper. Thailand's coach changed the formation from 1-4-4-2 to 1-4-2-3-1 towards the end of the first half and through the second half which had a positive impact on their play, enabling them to apply more pressure to China and to get more players forward in attack. They scored early in the second half to bring the game back to parity, with Janthawan (13) finding space from a corner to score with a header. Thailand then took the lead through a wonderful long range free-kick from Chuchuen Sudarat (9) in the 67th minute. With the rain making conditions more difficult, Thailand looked likely to win the match but China continued to apply pressure which resulted in a goal in added time to take the game to a penalty shootout.

China eventually won the shootout, 4-2. Thailand's third penalty taker missed, while China's goalkeeper Peng Shimeng (18) saved Thailand's fourth spot kick.

FINAL

DPR Korea v Japan, 1 - 1, 5-6 PSO



The final was an even match of contrasting styles between the best two teams in the competition. The first half was fairly even with both teams testing each other out in wet conditions. Japan enjoyed the better of the possession but DPR Korea looked dangerous with their counter attack in the wide areas.

Goal action occurred midway through the second half, with Japan taking the lead, 1-0, after Miura (14) capitalised on a rebound after a double save from the DPR Korea goalkeeper Kim Yong Sun (1) in the 63rd minute. Shortly after, DPR Korea levelled matters after a break down the right saw Wi Jong Sim (19) deliver a cross into the six-yard box with Sung Hyang Sim (11), a half-time substitute, sneaking in front of her defender to redirect the ball past the Japanese keeper, Matsumoto (1). Both teams looked for an equaliser in the remaining 20 minutes with both teams creating opportunities but without success. With the match ending with a 1-1 score line, the championship was decided by penalty shoot-out.

After the first five kickers of both teams converted their spot kicks, the penalty shoot-out went to sudden death. Japan took the lead after Matsubara (17) scored but it was goalkeeper Matsumoto (1) who gave Japan the championship after saving the shot of Kim Jong Sim (12). Japan were once again crowned AFC U-16 champions.



TOURNAMENT ANALYSIS • MEDICAL REPORT

At the AFC U-16 Women's Championship 2013, AFC Medical Officers Dr. Emily Merzo from Philippines and Dr. Farrah-Hani Imran from Malaysia oversaw the medical services and infrastructure at Jianning Sports Centre Stadium and Jiangsu Football Training Base Stadium respectively. Apart from assessing the medical services, the AFC Medical Officers were also responsible for conducting dope testing during the tournament.



IN-COMPETITION DOPING CONTROL

Doping testing was randomly carried-out during the competition in accordance with the routine in-competition procedure as per the AFC Anti-Doping Regulation. Two (2) players per team were randomly drawn to provide urine samples for doping testing. From 16 matches, 30 urine samples were analyzed for any prohibited substances at the WADA accredited laboratory in Beijing National Anti-Doping Centre, China PR. All tests proved to be negative.



Education and awareness is very important at this age group which is a valuable step forward in the fight against doping in Asia.

INJURY SURVEILLANCE

The injury surveillance is a continuous activity in all AFC tournaments, and is a fruitful source of inquiry in the field of sports medicine. With the increasing demands on the players and considering that players at the age of Under-16 are still in the stage of development, it is expected that highest incidences of injuries occur in major tournaments.

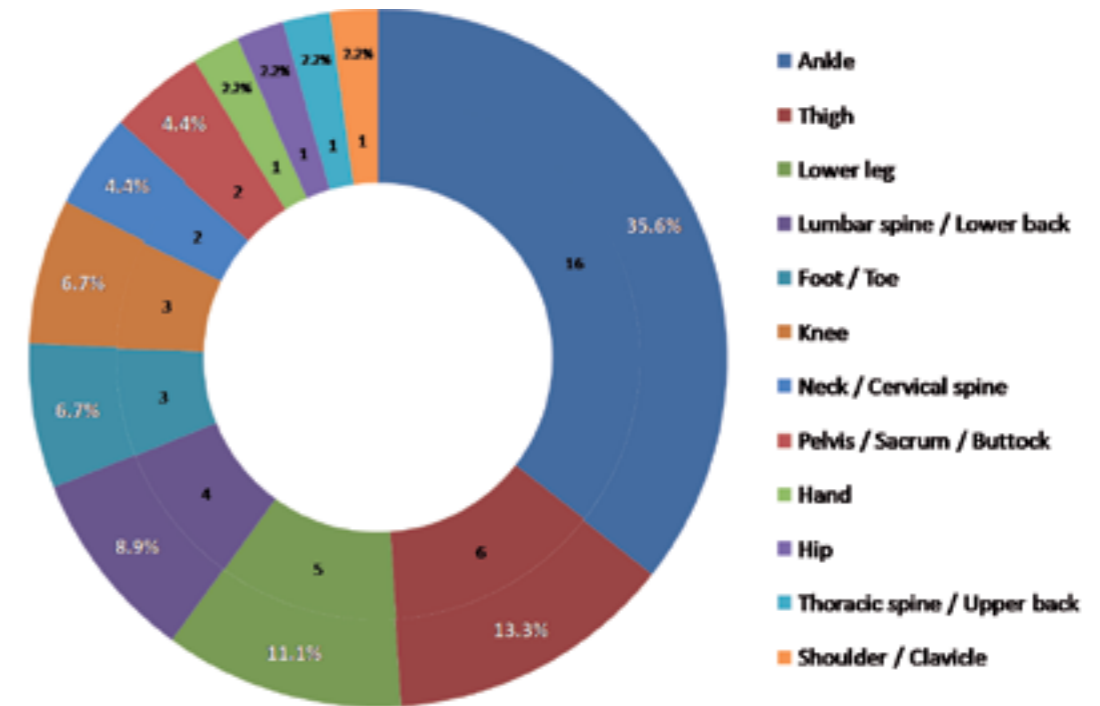
During the Team Physicians' coordination meeting held prior to the tournament, the team physicians were required to submit a match summary report on a standard FIFA/AFC injury form which comprises of location and nature of injuries, time of injuries, severity (a team physician-based estimate of absence), the team physician's professional judgment if a foul occurred, overuse either sudden or gradual onset, and non-contact trauma or non-contact.



Daily summary reports of the record of injuries that occurred during training or match days have been collected. Daily report forms were received from the team physicians and/or team physiotherapists with 90% compliance.

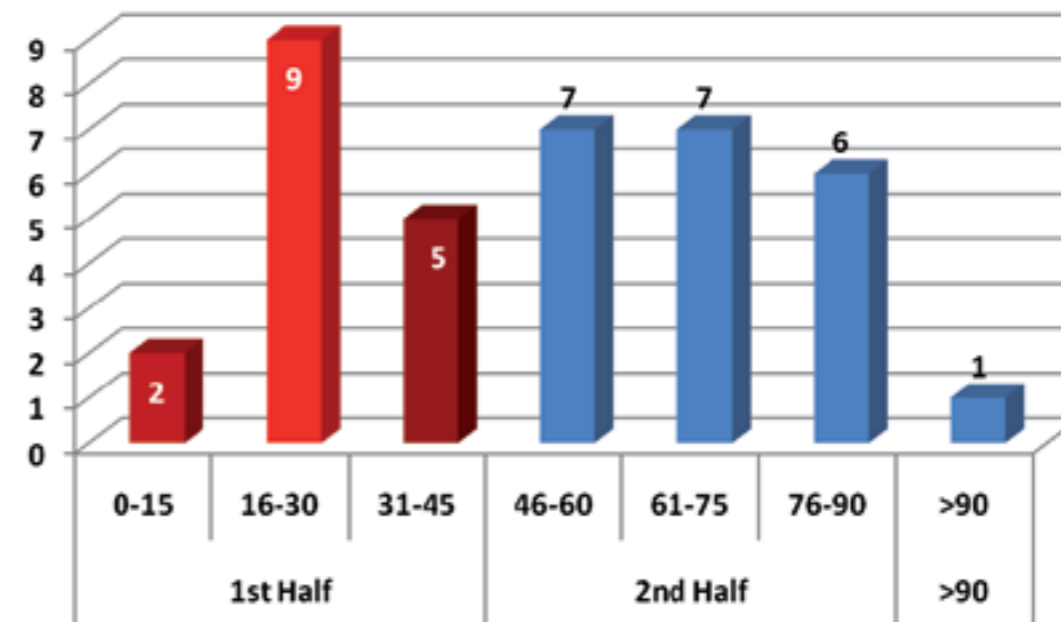
The team physicians and team physiotherapists recorded from 16 matches a total of 45 injuries which corresponded to a 2.8 injury ratio and a total of 45 injuries during training days. The top three locations of the injuries were ankle (16), thigh (6) and lower leg (5).

It was noted, however, that there were fewer injuries recorded in the 2011 U-16 Women's Championship which had an injury ratio of 1.3 (20 injuries).

The most common diagnoses were muscle spasms (28.9%), sprain (24.4%) and contusion/haematoma/bruise (20%).



The most number of injuries occurred during the middle of the 1st half (16-30 min) but consistently high during the 2nd half of the game. per 1000 hours and with severity of 0.1 with five days total of absence in matches and training over 52 injuries during the match.

10 referees and 12 assistant referees were also appointed. Two assistant referees were also appointed as stand-by, where-by, if any of the assistant referees could not pass the fitness test, the assistant referees would be replaced accordingly.

PREPARATORY COURSE - CLASSROOM SESSIONS

All classroom sessions were conducted at the Meeting Room on the 2nd floor of Hotel Lakeview Xuanwu. The environment of the room was conducive to conduct these sessions and the sessions were held with no disruption.

The 1st Theoretical Session was conducted on 24 Sep 2013 from 11.00 am to 12.30 pm at the Meeting Room. The 2nd Theoretical Session was conducted on 25 Sep 2013 from 8.30 am to 11.00 am.

Preparatory Course – Practical Session

A practical session prior to MD 1 was conducted on 25 Sep 2013 from 3.30 pm to 5.30 pm at the artificial turf pitch in Jiangsu Football Training Base. There were 22 players assisted it. The session covers:

- Referees Positioning
- Recognition of Fouls
- Recognition of Off-side
- Signaling etc.

The training focused mainly on the positioning of referees and especially the cooperation between the assistant referees and the referee on incidents that had happened near the penalty area. Even the signals for throw in, goal kick/corner kick, off-sides and fouls were also practiced.



Physical Training was conducted in the morning from 7am to 8am on Match Days except the Final Match Day at Xuanwu Lakeside Park which is about a five minute walk from Hotel Lakeview Xuanwu, as well as at the hotel's gym & swimming pool. The referees and the assistant referees who had assignments on the Match Day were excused from the physical training, whilst the Fourth Officials and those who had no assignments on the Match Day attended the training.



Practical Training was conducted in the morning from 10.30am to 12am on the Rest Days at Jiangsu Football Training Base which is about one hour by bus drive from Hotel Lakeview Xuanwu. We had 22 players from Jiangsu Football Training Base who assisted in every Practical Training except the ones on October 4 and 5 due to a National Holiday. At Practical Training, incidents that had happened during the previous matches were highlighted and mock-up incidents were created for the referees and the assistant referees to take appropriate action.



MATCH ANALYSIS

It was held on the Rest Day at the Meeting Room of Hotel Lakeview Xuanwu from 3pm to 5pm. The incidents of the previous matches were shown and the incidents that need corrective action were highlighted for all to learn and improve.

During the session, the discussion on what appropriate action that could be taken was shared and the decisions made by the referees and the assistant referees in the field were generally appropriate, however, there were still some areas to be developed further.

MATCH COORDINATION MEETINGS

To highlight on the matters on the Laws of the Game, Ms Krystyna Szokolai attended the Match Coordination Meetings on September 25 and October 2, 2013. The team officials were informed briefly on the administrations before the match, jersey colors of field players/goalkeepers and the referees and the assistant referees, as well behavior in the Technical Area.

MATCH DVDS

Thanks to the sincere effort and coordination of two AFC AV Unit staff, the match recordings were smoothly given to the technical instructors by DVDs at Hotel Lakeview Xuanwu within two hours after the matches complete despite 1 hour transportation from the Match Venues. The instructors were able to review the match recordings and to edit these matches for the match analysis.

INSTRUCTORS TECHNICAL MEETING

This was held at 2.30pm on the Rest Day prior to the match analysis to coordinate on the incidents that needs to be highlighted during the match analysis.

REFEREES RELEASE

After the last match day of Group Stage (MD3), 3 referees & 2 assistant referees were released to maintain 7 referees & 10 assistant referees for Semi Finals and afterward. After Semi Finals, 3 referees & 4 assistant referees were released to maintain 4 referees & 6 assistant referees for Final Match and 3rd/4th Placing Match.

Note:
For AFC U-19 Women's Championship China 2013 which was held consecutively in Nanjing (11 to 20 Oct 2013), 1 referee was appointed as referee, 1 referee as stand-by, 1 assistant referee as assistant referee and 2 assistant referees as stand-by. This consecutive appointment made 1 extra assistant referee without assignment on the Final Match Day.



5th Official was appointed on the Final Match. The Official was located between left team bench and stretcher bearers. All five Final Match referees and assistant referees were given the commemorative medals in the closing ceremony.



REFEREES GENERAL PERFORMANCE

PHYSICAL FITNESS

The referees and the assistant referees were physically fit during this tournament thanks to the physical trainings and conditionings conducted by the Fitness Instructor. Based on this good Physical Fitness, they were able to sprint well and positioned themselves appropriately.

TECHNICAL

Most of the decisions made on the field of play were correct. 27 cautions and nil sent-off were recorded to the participated 12 teams out of 16 matches played during this tournament. No complaint from the team for refereeing was received. Furthermore, no incident on refereeing matter was reported by Match Commissioners.

However, the Technical Instructors found there were four critical decisions that the referees had to make during this tournament. These decisions were highlighted to the referees and the assistant referees in the Match Analysis to enable them to learn from the decisions and improve themselves.

CONCLUSION

The Refereeing team cooperated very well and work together as one team. With the good support from the local organizers, in providing excellent coordinators / liaison officers, very good facilities for fitness test, field for training, good transport services and good facilities such as swimming pool and the gymnasium for self recovery in the hotel, and other logistical needs. It contributed indeed for the good performance of the referees and the assistant referees.

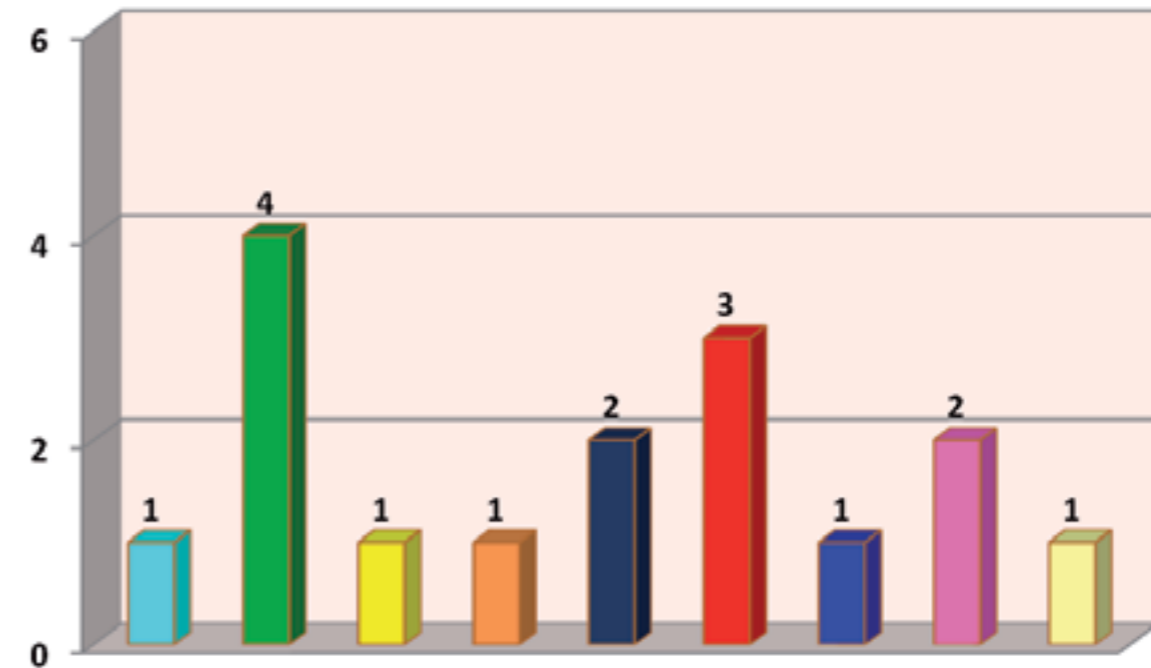
